O'Neill, one of Prescott's most memorable citizens came to the Prescott area and served in the territorial capital as court reporter, probate judge, sheriff, and mayor.

ON CUT BACKS by Ab Jackson, CEO



You may have seen the recent George Clooney movie *Up In the Air.* It seems a sure bet for many Oscar nominations this month.

In the movie Clooney plays a management consultant who works for a firm that specializes in helping other companies who are

undergoing personnel cutbacks. Clooney flies into the city and counsels the employees that are being laid off-rather than have the bad news come from the actual management of that company.

Clooney is having a pretty good life rolling up frequent flyer miles when his own company decides to change its business model. He is now faced with giving up the life on the road that he loves and doing all his work by tele-conferencing.

I suppose Clooney's character's expertise is needed more than ever today as businesses cut back personnel. You hear lots of euphemisms for lay-offs today. In the old days you got fired or canned. Today you get downsized, right-sized, reengineered, displaced, discharged, dismissed, axed, sacked, pink-slipped, de-layered (ouch), and having 'your future freed up.'

Harvey Mackay writes about this most traumatic part of working in his new book, <u>We Got Fired...And It's the Best Thing That Ever Happened To Us.</u> In the book Mackay shares insight from some of the world's most successful people who've been laid off and how they rebounded. By the way an earlier Mackay book, <u>Dig Your Well Before You're Thirsty</u>, is also a nice companion piece for your future success.

Realizing that the government can't turn around our economy or our lives, and in the words of Dr. Terry Lovell, "Nobody's coming to rescue us," let's use the language of personnel hiring and firing to set some goals for ourselves:

- Success comes in "cans" not cannots. In <u>Boomtown</u> author Jack Schultz says our town needs a 'Can-Do Attitude'-to be visionary. Let's look beyond the current challenges and plan for the future.
- **Displace** inertia with action. Take advantage of the tremendous networking opportunities offered by the Chamber. Over 100 people attended the Business Luncheon in January

- and-nearly 100 more at the Mixer the next week. That's lots of networking opportunity.
- Layoff sweets (that one's for me).
- **Fire Up!** Go see two former clients today and invite them back to your shop. Our Chamber is involved in a yearlong Shop Locally Campaign-join us.
- **Downsize** excess clutter. Let's make our operations lean and mean. Let's also encourage our local and state governments to avoid new regulations that further inhibit business from being successful. If you've never written your state or federal congresspersons, now is a great time to let them know how you feel.
- **De-layer** excess bureaucracy. See comments above.
- Employ best practices. In January we began the Leadership Academy at the Chamber. The Academy takes the place of our former Brown Bag program. We plan to roll the Academy into a community Leadership Academy and ultimately into a CV Citizens Academy in 2011. - Sack the No-Nos. No-No is a character from John Kotter's, <u>Our Iceberg Is Melting</u>.
 According to Kotter, No-No's are people who kill <u>urgency</u>- and we can't afford relationships with urgency killers in our lives.
- Axe (sorry) not what your community can do for you. Ask what you can do for your community. The Health, Home, and Business Expo on March 13 is a great opportunity to get exposure for your community. Hundreds attended last year. Booth fees are just \$100.00. One of our exhibitors sold a house at Health/Home/Biz!!! I'd call that return on your investment.
