ADDRESS CHANGE

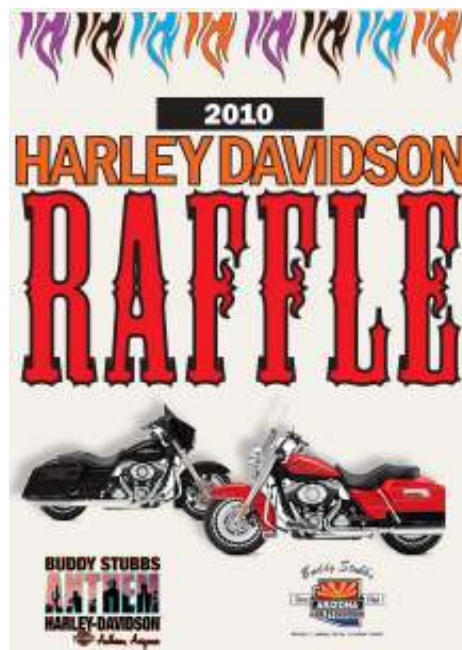

ON COMMUNICATION

You may recall the great scene from 1942's film, "*Pride of The Yankees*", when Lou Gehrig (played by Gary Cooper) is addressing a crowd at Yankee Stadium. He is announcing his retirement by saying, "Today, I am the luckiest man on the face of the earth." That address was apparently pretty short.

Many of the great speeches are shorter ones. Dr. King's "I Have A Dream" speech is less than 20 minutes. The Gettysburg Address is 272 words. You might be interested to know that Lincoln wasn't to be the keynote speaker that day at Gettysburg. The keynote was delivered by Edward Everett and ran over 2 hours. George Washington's second inaugural address was 135 total words, while William Henry Harrison spoke for over 2 hours-8,444 words-got sick that day and died within a month of taking office. Recently I delivered Chino Valley High School's graduation speech. After the speech was over, I received lots of positive feedback although my speech went a little too long (not, however, as long as Edward Everett and President Harrison). Several people have commented about how uncomfortable they are speaking in public.

In fact, public speaking usually appears as no.1 or no. 2 on the list of things Americans fear most. The Boston Globe's top ten phobia's list of 2009 had public speaking (#1) and snakes (#2) at the top fears, while storms (#9) and deep water (#10) were at the bottom. Said another way, most Americans would rather get hit by lightning or drown than speak in public.

I always recommend a couple of my favorite books on public speaking-Secrets of Successful Speakers by Lilly Walters and High Impact Presentation and Training Skills by Micki Holliday - as great resources. One of our future chamber brown bags will include Presentation Skills as a topic. Here are a few tips to make your talks more effective.

1. Less is more. (I should have followed this rule for my recent speech). If you are requested to give a 20 minute speech, write a 15 minute speech. You will find you won't rush as much, can pause effectively, and the shorter talk will be appreciated. Just

remember, William Henry Harrison literally talked himself to death.

2. Always have handouts for your speech. A majority of us are visual learners. Plus the handout helps re-enforce your main points. Experts say it takes six repetitions of an idea to internalize it.
3. Join Toastmasters. If you are really serious about being an effective speaker, get involved with the best self-help club there is- Toastmasters. The quad cities area has several clubs. Call me at the Chamber to find out more.

I will try to follow the above rules at our June Membership Luncheon. I believe it will be our best Luncheon this year. Our Chamber was established 25 years ago. On June 9, we begin celebration of the anniversary. We are inviting back many of our early members as well as our 21 Past-Chamber Presidents. We will ratify some new Board members. And, we have lots of drawings and surprises - don't miss the Luncheon!!!

Lastly, thanks to Susan Tobey and Dean Echols for chairing a terrific Fabulous Fifties Casino Night. Our members had a blast, Daddy-O, and the Chamber raised some much needed dollars. Thanks to all who came, and again especially to Susan, Dean and your terrific committee!!

Winston Churchill was also a great presenter. My favorite Churchill speech was the one delivered to an Academy Graduation during WWII. He said, "Never, never, never, never give up." Now that's a speech.
