VOTERS APPROVE PROPOSITION 401

At the election held in May, Chino Valley residents approved approximately 2 to 1 Proposition 401 which allowed the rezoning of the acreage of the proposed KOA. With voter approval the KOA can move forward.

LET'S TALK ABOUT THE KOA. . . .

Linda McFarland spoke with Jack Tuls, Jr. about the future of the KOA project in Chino Valley.

Linda Mc: The Chino Valley voters approved Proposition 401 which allowed for the zoning change. We are very excited to see the KOA completed. What is next and when do you expect the KOA to be completed?

Jack Tuls: Now that the zoning is in place it is full steam ahead. We have submitted the loan papers for the project and we will turn in the plans to the Town. Our goal is to open by mid-March, 2012.

Linda Mc: There are both cabins and RV spaces planned. How many of them will be on the site? And, tell us some of the amenities that will be available.

Jack Tuls: There will be 119 (pull-thru) RV spaces. In the first phase there will be 13 cabins, with 32 cabins altogether. For guests, there will be a club house, swimming pool, and recreation area. The recreation area, for example, will include ping pong, basketball, and horseshoe pit. Just to name a few.

Linda Mc: How will the KOA be accessed by visitors?

Jack Tuls: To enter the KOA campers will pull off from Highway 89. The road that will be built is designated Road 3 ½ North.

Linda Mc: Is there anything you would especially like to say to our Chamber members?

Jack Tuls: I am grateful to Chino First for supporting economic development in Chino Valley. I have owned the property for three years, and in that time nothing has happened. This project is a starting point for economic development. If you don't move forward, you go backward. There is no just remaining still.

ON CALCULATED RISK-TAKING

You may remember the terrific little film, “*The Replacements*,” with Gene Hackman and Keanu Reeves (as Shane Falco). The film is based on the 1987 NFL players’ strike and the replacement players that were hired to finish the season. Hackman (as Coach Jimmy McGinty) chooses

Falco to quarterback his team the Washington Sentinels. Falco bombed in his final college game and was a laughingstock. But Hackman loves him for his great arm and risk-taking; he takes a risk and drafts Falco. One of my favorite moments in the film is an end-zone dance that Falco and the other victorious Sentinels do to the tune of “I Will Survive” by Gloria Gaynor.

I have mentioned the new book [Surviving Your Serengeti](#) in this column once before. The author Stefan Swanepoel utilizes animals of the Serengeti that he observed growing up in Kenya as analogies for his 7 skills to mastering business and life. For skill number six-risk taking, he chooses the Daring Mongoose:

“As a general rule Mongooses will outmaneuver their predators. They are quick and agile. . . .But it is their courage and willingness to take risks that makes them so unique. Life out here doesn’t stand still; taking risks is an integral part of everyday survival.”

As we begin the new year of the Chamber, I am convinced that standing pat is not an option for our Chamber. We must be as bold as the Mongoose in this new fiscal year and continue to offer a good investment for our members and support for our community.
