TERRITORIAL DAYS EVENTS

Celebrating Territorial Capital Days is not just one day - it starts on Saturday, August 28 and ends on Sunday, September 5. Be part of Chino Valley's celebration of its past and present.

The **Chino Valley Lions** traditional **Annual Pancake Breakfast** is **Saturday, August 28**, from **6:00am - 10:00am** at the Chino Valley Senior Center, 1021 W Butterfield Road. The donation for the breakfast is \$5.00 for adults and \$4.00 for children 12 & under. Tickets are available at the Chamber office.

The **24th Annual Territorial Capital Days Parade** is **Saturday, August 28**. The Parade starts at **9:30am** and will process from Heritage Middle School to Memory Park. The Parade theme is "**Ride the High Plains**" and applications for parade entries are available at the Chamber office or online at the Chamber's website: www.chinovalley.org. Registration for parade entrants begins at 8:00am at Heritage Middle School.

Following the Parade on Saturday, August 28, the Town of Chino Valley will host activities in **Memory Park** from **11:00am - 3:00pm**. There will be activities for the family. Booth applications are available from Chino Valley Parks & Recreation Department, www.chinoaz.net, under Recreation.

On **Thursday, September 2**, Chino Valley Parks & Recreation is hosting **Dinner & A Movie in Memory Park**. Dinner will be from **6:00-8:00pm** and the movie will begin at approximately **8:00pm** (dusk). There will be a charge for dinner, but the movie is free. The movie is appropriate for all ages!

2010 HOMELESS VETERANS STAND DOWN

U.S. Vets-Prescott has been the non-profit sponsor of the Northern Arizona Veterans Stand Down since 2006. The Stand Down is an event held in cities all over the nation to provide food, clothing, services, and referrals to homeless veterans. The term Stand Down is used in times of war when exhausted combat units requiring time to rest and recover are removed from the battlefield to a place of relative security and safety. Today the Stand Down refers to a grassroots, community-based intervention program designed to help the nation's estimated 130,000 homeless veterans "combat" life on the streets.

This year's Stand Down will be held on **September 10 & 11** at the **Prescott United Methodist Church**, 505 W Gurley Street. Monetary pledges and/or donations of goods will benefit homeless veterans in their time of need and vulnerability. You may recall Nick Nolte and Mac Davis in “North Dallas Forty.” The movie is based on a book by former Dallas Cowboy, Pete Gent. Even though the team in the movie is called the Bulls, it’s clear that Gent meant to take swipes at his former team the Cowboys, and at their quarterback, Don

Meredith, and Coach Tom Landry.

Love ‘em or hate ‘em the Dallas Cowboys are one of the most recognizable brands in professional sports. In fact Forbes.Com ranks the Dallas Cowboys brand value at 208 million dollars, fourth behind Manchester United, the New York Yankees, and Real Madrid. Mention the Cowboys and you conjure up images of helmets with a big blue star, cheerleaders, super bowls, and excellence.

In “Branding Your Community”, Susan Combs, Commissioner from the Texas Department of Agriculture lists her favorite Brand Slogans:

1. “Don’t Mess With Texas.”
2. “Texas-It’s like a Whole Other Country.”
3. Snyder, Texas- “Home of the White Buffalo.”
4. Pecos, Texas- “Home of the World’s First Rodeo.” (wonder what Prescott thinks of that?)
5. Madisonville, Texas- “The Mushroom Capital of Texas.”

Susan Combs also listed her seven secrets for community branding. Among them were:

- Commitment by City Leaders to common goals and a long-term vision.
- A deliberately inclusive and detailed planning process.
- Professional marketing research and willingness to accept the findings.
- A solid, creative design process and flawless execution.
- The willingness of city-related groups to partner together, adopting one consistent branding strategy and logo building individual marketing plans, in support of the overall City Master Plan.
- Immediate and visible use of the brand.
- The efforts of the most important brand ambassadors - city employees and citizens.

We’ve been spending a lot of time lately talking about the Chino Valley Brand. Our neighbors already have “Arizona’s Home Town” (Prescott) and “The Entertainment District”(Prescott Valley). Offered up for Chino Valley has been “The High Plains Adventure,” “Arizona’s Horse Capital,” “Charming Chino” and more. We hope to add discussion of the Brand at a future Mayor’s ED Committee meeting.

Back to the Brown Bags, we will be starting the Chino Valley Citizens Academy in October. The Academy is where the future leaders of our community will come to learn Chino 101. We anticipate a six-eight week program. The curriculum will include: 1-Town Government; 2- Public Safety; 3-Economic Development; 4-Chamber of Commerce; 5-CVUSD; 6-Finance; and 7-the Chino Valley nonprofits. We hope to conduct the sessions at the Chamber’s new home on 175 East Road 2 South.

You will remember the new location as the former Bronco Homes site. We are excited about the fabulous access; signage, and extra room the location will provide us. Thanks to the more than 30 Chamber members who joined us on our July 9 workday. The place is looking great. We have a paint-day coming in the next two weeks. Watch your emails for the announcement of the Paint Day and Grand Opening-Mixer.

It’s not too late to get your Territorial Days Parade entry in. The parade is on August 28. Territorial Days runs all week with the celebration including the 60+ year old FFA Corn Dinner and western and English events at Yavapai College on Labor Day weekend.

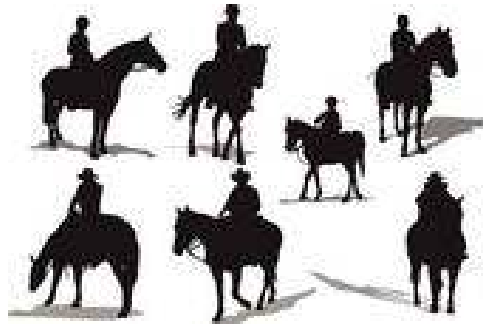
