BUSINESS/EDUCATORS QUARTERLY BREAKFAST HELD

The September Business/Educators Quarterly Breakfast was hosted by the Chino Valley School District at Bonn-Fire Chillin' & Grillin' on Thursday, September 16. Guest speaker Yavapai County Attorney, SHEILA POLK, spoke to the subject of why citizens, business owners, parents, law enforcement, and educators should vote NO on Proposition 203.

According to Ms. Polk Proposition 203, commonly called the medical marijuana initiative, has serious repercussions if passed by Arizona voters.

Businesses that promote safety in the workplace with drug testing could no longer deny employment to marijuana card holders nor terminate marijuana card holders who test positive for marijuana on the job. Law enforcement could not use blood testing results on marijuana card holders for proof of operating a motor vehicle while impaired, including commercial vehicles. Blood results are the most effective way of proving impairment in court. Ms. Polk further told attendees that medical marijuana is already available legally, and meets standards for dosage.

In addition to being County Attorney, Sheila Polk chairs the Yavapai County Substance Abuse Coalition (MATForce). Information about Proposition 203 can be found on the MATForce web site: www.matforce.org. The office of the Yavapai County Attorney can also be reached by calling 928-771-3344.

Consider some of these statistics about the marijuana available today. The marijuana grown today is 8-12 times more potent than the marijuana available in the 1960's. The carcinogens found in one marijuana joint are equal to five tobacco cigarettes. There are over 400 known substances in marijuana and many of them have known detrimental side effects, but most of the side effects of both short term and long term use are not known.



Sheila Polk (pictured left) urged breakfast attendees to let friends and family know the negative impact of Proposition 203, and to encourage Arizona voters to vote no on Proposition 203. This is the fourth time since 1996 that the issue has been put before Arizona voters, and defeated either by the courts or voters the previous times.
